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INTRODUCTION TO STUDENT HANDBOOK

Each student need to possess and make use of the school handbook to record their school activities and home work

- ❖ It must be brought to the school on all working and special days.
- ❖ To refer to the Handbook daily to keep in touch with the day to day progress of their wards.
- ❖ To take a serious note of the remark, homework, instructions made in the Handbook and to be signed by parents/ guardians on regular basis.
- ❖ To make use of the Handbook to establish a valuable liaison with teachers
- ❖ To use the school Handbook as a reference of student's work and conduct and not for criticism.
- ❖ To make use of the School Handbook for daily/monthly specified schedule for examination, holidays, vacations and competitions.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOUR

- ❖ "A Basic Foundation for a virtuous life" Discipline is the continual exercise of the will, enlightened by the intellect so that it may act easily and habitually according to right order and help the child to attain self mastery.
- ❖ The school begins with assembly and the students must be on time for the morning school assembly.
- ❖ Students who are often found not in proper uniform and are late to school are liable to be sent home or debarred from attending the day's class.
- ❖ Students against whom there are serious or frequent complaints are liable to suspension or expulsion.
- ❖ The Principal is empowered to request the withdrawal of a student or to remove the name of the student from the school rolls if the progress or conduct of such student is in the opinion of the Principal, unsatisfactory.
- ❖ Under no circumstances retest / exam will be conducted for absentees.
- ❖ The school will not be responsible for the loss of any personal property brought to school by the students.

- ❖ All students are expected to come to school in neat and complete uniform. Personal hygiene and neatness must be given importance. Students are expected to maintain high standards of personal conduct including honesty, discipline, ethics and values.
- ❖ Students are not permitted to bring cell phones and cameras to school. They are also forbidden to bring valuable articles such as jewellery, costly pens, wrist watches and excess cash to the School. If earrings are worn then they must be small hoops or studs. Nose rings, bangles, rings, anklets, bracelets, tattoo, mehendi, nail enamel of any kind are not permitted.
- ❖ Irrespective of the above stipulations, BIKH reserves the right to summarily expel any student who indulges in gross misbehavior, flagrant offenses and any act that damages the image/reputation of BIKH.
- ❖ Children are advised to behave in an orderly manner in the school and in public places. Use of swear words and foul language, scribbling and scratching on school furniture and school walls and any misbehavior will be strictly dealt with.
- ❖ ID card is a must. Failing which the student will not be allowed inside the School. In case of ID cards being broken or damaged, it must be replaced by paying a fine.
- ❖ No games shall be played in the class rooms. Any violation of this rule will result in payment of fine/expulsion, in case of injury to other students.
- ❖ Students can distribute Chocolates only (or similar ones) among friends and educators on their birthdays. No parties of students will be held in the class. No return gifts will be exchanged between the teachers and the students in the class.
- ❖ Students should take part in all the School activities whole – heartedly.

RULES FOR ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

- ❖ The School admits boys and girls, as per the availability of seats.
- ❖ While applying for admission, the following documents should be furnished.
- ❖ Original Transfer Certificate for Grade I to IX duly countersigned by the competent authorities.
- ❖ Study certificate from Prep III/ UKG to grade I.

- ❖ Photo copy of birth certificate for Prep-I to grade X.
- ❖ Photocopy of the progress report/marks sheet of the previous grade from grade I onwards.
- ❖ Date of birth of the child, once recorded in the school by the parent at the time of admission will not be altered under any circumstances.
- ❖ All applications for withdrawal should be made to the Principal, through the school office, after clearing all dues to the school, with three months of prior notice in writing.

LIBRARY RULES

- ❖ Strict discipline and silence are to be observed in the Library and Reading Room.
- ❖ Library books can be issued and returned during library period only and not in any teaching period.
- ❖ Library books should be properly maintained and returned on the due date.
- ❖ Marking, underlining, cutting and erasing or dog-tearing pages of the books are strictly prohibited and liable to be punished if any such damage to library books is detected by the Librarian.
- ❖ The Librarian may recall a book at any time in case of urgency.
- ❖ Library Books are to be returned at least one week before leaving the station or any break, and one month before any vacation.
- ❖ No Due Certificate for each Pupil his/her to be obtained from the Librarian while withdrawing any student from the school.

GENERAL RULES

- ❖ Pupils must be punctual. They should come to school at least five minutes before the school starts. Those who come late, must bring the Late Attendance Record (in the school Diary).
- ❖ School uniform is compulsory and pupils shall come to school wearing the prescribed uniform. They shall come clean and tidy, with a trim hairdo.
- ❖ Pupils are not allowed to meet parents or visitors or to leave the school premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal.
- ❖ No pupil shall absent himself/herself without leave previously obtained except in case of unforeseen circumstances, applications for leave must be submitted on the following day.
- ❖ When long leave / leave during tests and examinations / becomes necessary due to unavoidable circumstances, permission from the Principal has to be sought and obtained in advance.
- ❖ Pupils are expected to keep the school premises clean. They are forbidden to write or scribble on walls, throw paper or ink in

the classroom or in any way to damage the school properties. Any such act will be entailed for recovery of cost.

- ❖ Pupils are strictly forbidden to introduce any sort of objectionable literature into school or sell or purchase any article/food among themselves or from unauthorized dealers near the school.
- ❖ Regular attendance, alertness in mind and body, prompt completion of homework, obedience and respect towards teachers and other members of staff, gentle and polite behavior are expected of every pupil. They are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both inside and outside the school.
- ❖ Speaking in English is a must in the school premises.
- ❖ Any pupil caught cheating during an assessment will get zero mark for that subject.
- ❖ All instructions issued from time to time should be carefully complied with.
- ❖ Pupils must bring the school Hand Book to school every day and note down home assignments and important instructions given by the teachers.
- ❖ Pupils will not be allowed to go home during exams on half-a-day leave.
- ❖ Pupils are themselves responsible for their books, money, cycles, tiffin carriers and other articles. It is not advisable for pupils to have money or valuable articles with them.
- ❖ Cycles must be parked in an orderly way and kept locked.
- ❖ Revision assignment given every month should be duly completed.

REDUCING THE LOAD OF THE BAG

- ❖ Follow “My Bag” concept.
- ❖ Students to carry books as per the class Time Table to reduce the load of the bag

NORMS FOR VAN STUDENTS

For the safety of all students who board the bus, students are expected to obey the following rules:

- ❖ Follow the queue system while boarding and alighting buses.
- ❖ Show ID card to the care taker while boarding the bus.
- ❖ Give respect to the driver and care taker, wish them and thank them.
- ❖ Start occupying the bus from the last row and last seat. Avoid reserving seats for others. Allow the next student getting in, to sit next to you.
- ❖ Treat all students as your friends.
- ❖ Help the younger students.
- ❖ Discuss, learn, exchange ideas and enjoy the pleasure of the company of friends while commuting in the school bus.
- ❖ Avoid rushing and pushing others.
- ❖ Students must use only the bus and the bus stop assigned to them.
- ❖ Students may not enter or leave the bus at any place except the student's regular bus stop or school unless the students have a note from home that has been approved by the Principal.
- ❖ Students must stay in their seat while the bus is in motion.
- ❖ Students must keep the aisle of the bus clear at all times. Items such as books or bags must not block the aisle.
- ❖ Students must obey all bus safety rules and follow the directions of their bus driver.
- ❖ Students must not litter the bus, throw anything out of the window, or cause damage to the bus.

1st Offence A documented warning from the driver.

2nd Offence Warning and communication to Parent by the administrator.

3rd Offence Bus suspension for one day.

4th Offence Bus suspension for two days.

5th Offence Final Suspension and bus services denied.

ATTENDANCE AND ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- ❖ A student must compulsorily attend the first day of the school term and the last day of the school term.
- ❖ If a student is absent due to illness, the class teacher must be informed in writing and medical certificate with the parent's application should be sent to the Principal's office if the leave is for more than 3 days.

- ❖ Half - a - day's leave will not be granted. A child once reported to school must attend the full session unless there is an emergency.
- ❖ Under no circumstance should a parent send a child to School after an infectious/contagious illness or any other sickness and till he/ she is completely recovered.
- ❖ If absence is on account of illness, a certificate of fitness from the doctor must be produced on returning to school, along with the application for leave.
- ❖ Leave letter must be addressed to the Principal and not to the Class Teacher. The same should be submitted in an A4 size sheet and enclosed in an envelope.
- ❖ No pupil should be absent for more than two days without obtaining prior permission from the Principal.

- ❖ **Wednesday** – Boys - White T-shirt with Red shorts and white Liberty shoes & white socks with red stripes.
- ❖ **Wednesday** – Girls - White T-shirt with Red shorts, white Liberty shoes & white sock with red stripes.
- ❖ Apron, Navy blue colour sweat shirt and school bag with school logo.

Primary Grade I-IV

- ❖ **Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday Grade I - IV**
- ❖ **Boys'uniform** - white shirt, beige shorts, red checks tie, beige belt, Maroon sweater, white socks with beige stripes and black Lee cooper shoes.
- ❖ **Girls'uniform** - white shirt, beige skirt, bloomer, red checks tie, beige belt, Maroon sweater, white socks with beige stripes and black Lee cooper shoes.
- ❖ **Wednesday** – house colour track pant, T shirt, white Liberty shoes and house colour jacket.
- ❖ **School bag with school logo**

Middle School: Grade V - X

- ❖ **Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday**
- ❖ **Boys' uniform** - white shirt, beige trousers, red checks tie, beige belt, beige colour blazer, white socks with beige stripes and black Lee cooper shoes.
- ❖ **Girls' uniform** - white shirt, beige skirt, bloomer, red checks tie, beige belt, beige colour blazer, white socks with beige stripes and black Lee cooper shoes.
- ❖ **Wednesday** – house colour track pant, T shirt, white Liberty shoes and house colour jacket.
- ❖ **School bag with school logo**
- ❖ Girls with hair length below the shoulder should tie their hair in two neat plaits. Use of black hair pins/ hair bands/ ribbons/ rubber bands is only permissible. No nail enamels is permissible in school. Boys should exhibit a neat and trim haircut in school. No fancy haircut is permissible in school.

- ❖ To meet the Class teachers on a working Saturday on prior appointment at School Office.
- ❖ To meet Pre-Primary teachers from 12.35pm to 1.00pm.

FEE REGULATIONS

Mode of Payment

- ❖ If fees and fine are not paid for three consecutive months, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls of the School.
- ❖ Thereafter, if the student requires re-admission he/she will have to pay all the admission charges.
- ❖ Re-admission may be given subject to vacancy.
- ❖ If 10th happens to be a holiday, fees should be paid on the following working day.
- ❖ The parents are requested to adhere to the rules and regulations laid down below for fee collection.
- ❖ School fee is payable on quarterly basis i.e. 3 months fee at a time as per the details given below.

- ❖ Fee paid after 30th of the scheduled month will be incurred with an additional penalty .

TRANSPORTATION FEE

- ❖ Transport fee payable by the students computing by school van should be paid by the 10th of these months. If not paid, the transport facility will be forfeited. Once the Van facility is availed, it should continue till the end of the academic year.
- ❖ I Quarterly Fee June to August
- ❖ II Quarterly Fee September to November
- ❖ III Quarterly Fee December to February
- ❖ IV Quarterly Fee March to May

MY HEALTH PROGRAMME ?

The school has an Infirmary equipped with emergency procedures and first aid to attend any illness sickness or accidents.

- ❖ Students should not attend the school if he/she is suffering with serious or contagious disease. They will be allowed to attend the school again when a medical certificate is produced. ? If any medical attention is required specifically please keep the authorities of the school informed at all times with doctor's prescription attached.

- ❖ To enrich the school curriculum, field trips and excursions are planned by the school. Every precaution will be taken for the safety of all the students.

ACCIDENTS

- ❖ All precautions are taken to protect the children from accidents when they are in the school or while playing. However, in the event of any mishap immediate first aid will be administered and the pupil involved will be sent to Hospital for treatment, if necessary. Hospital bills if any should be paid by the Parent or guardian.

PARENT CONCERNS

- ❖ BIKH wants the best for your child. We encourage parents to call if they have questions, concerns, or suggestions. If you have a school-related concern, you should contact your child's class teacher, and then the Principal if needed.

CREATE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES AT HOME

- ❖ Did you know that your home can be a classroom too? In addition to learning at school, there are many wonderful opportunities for learning at home and in the community. Offer your child different types of reading materials such as magazines, newspapers and books. Take time to read with your child every day. Talk to your child often as you work around the house, run errands and shop to build vocabulary and develop critical thinking skills. Also, be sure to set aside time each day for your child to do his/her home assignment and take the time to talk about what your child is learning in school.

NOTE TO PARENTS

- ❖ PARENTS ARE REQUESTED NOT TO ENTER THE CLASSROOM or meet the teachers without prior permission of the Principal.
- ❖ Parents desires of taking Transfer Certificate must submit the application, sixty days in advance along with TC Charge.
- ❖ Leave application must be signed by the Parent/ Guardian only.
- ❖ Photography in the campus is prohibited.
- ❖ Parents ought to leave their wards at the gate and not to enter the class room. Receive them at the gate only, soon after the school hours.
- ❖ Don't allow your wards to come to School with cell phones, cameras and other costly items.

- ❖ Parents must send their children in neat and tidy uniform to the School.
- ❖ Parents must make text books, notebooks and other study material available to their wards as per the requirement.
- ❖ Parents must come to School whenever informed by the Principal/Teachers.
- ❖ Parents must attend Parents – Teachers Meeting whenever conveyed by the School.
- ❖ In case of any suggestion, parents may send a mail or personally meet the Principal.
- ❖ Parents should take part in all the School activities whole – heartedly.
- ❖ Complaints of any student must be made to the Principal.
- ❖ No pupil is allowed to leave the School premises without the written permission of the Principal during school hours.
- ❖ Parents are expected to check and sign the School Handbook daily. Note sent from the School should be read carefully and signed.
- ❖ Parents are requested to refer to the School Calendar before planning a vacation or booking tickets.
- ❖ Photographs for attestation by the Principal on all documents should be in School Uniform.
- ❖ Parents are requested to co- operate with the School authorities in enforcing discipline for the overall development of the child and the school.
- ❖ Leave for a day or two must be mentioned at the back of the handbook in the leave note.
- ❖ If School Handbook is lost, it will be available on payment in the school office.
